The Sparta Manufacturing Company, under the ownership and management of Clennel Richardson, prominent Sparta con-tractor, is supplying Santa Claus with plenty of wagons this year. With metal toys almost unheard of articles on the market, Santa was beginning to wonder what he would have to offer boys and girls in their places but the prob-lem seems to have been easily solved by Mr. Richardson and his wooden wagons.

During the past two weeks, Mr. Richardson has sent out over 2000 wagons to be shipped by rail to the far corners of the country. California, New York, Michigan, Illinois, Georgia and North and South Carolina are among the states that will display the model. play the wooden toys from Sparta this Christmas season.

The manufacturing plant, located in the old D, and P. pipe factory, was started in the late summer and has been in operation since, employing seven workmen. A new building to house the plant is now under construction east of Sparta on the Elkin highway. The new build-ing is expected to be completed soon, Mr. Richardson stated.
