Last Shot Fired By Patton's Army On Western Front

V-E Day Comes After Five Years, Eight Months And Seven Days Of War

Paris - Germany bowed Wedesday to the most crushing defeat ever inflicted upon a nation, ner abject surrender proclaimed to the world by the United States, Britain and Russia.

The Moscow radio in behalf of Premier Marshal Stalin, whose Red armies broke the armed might of Hitler's reich on the astern front, announced the unconditional surrender to the Russian people at 1:10 a. m., Wednesday, ten hours and ten minutes after President Truman and Prime Minister Churchill proclaimed V-E day on Tuesday. Signed In Berlin

The announcement said the final articles of capitulation were signed Tuesday in Berlin, the ruined capital symbolic of the fall of the third reich.

Field Marshal Wilhelm von Kietel, chief of the German high command, signed the articles in the presence of Marshal Gregory K. Zhukov, assistant commander of the Red armies; Air Chief Marshal Sir Arthur Tedder, deputy supreme commander in the west; Gen. Carl A. Spaatz, chief of the U. S. strategic air forces in Europe, and Lt. Gen. Jean de Lattre


