

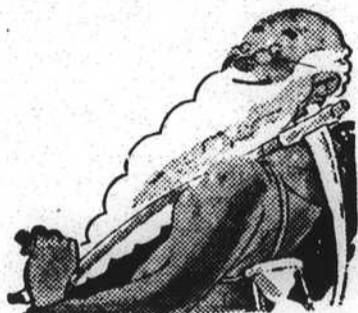

 Byron Stuart, who was recently discharged from military service, is visiting friends here.



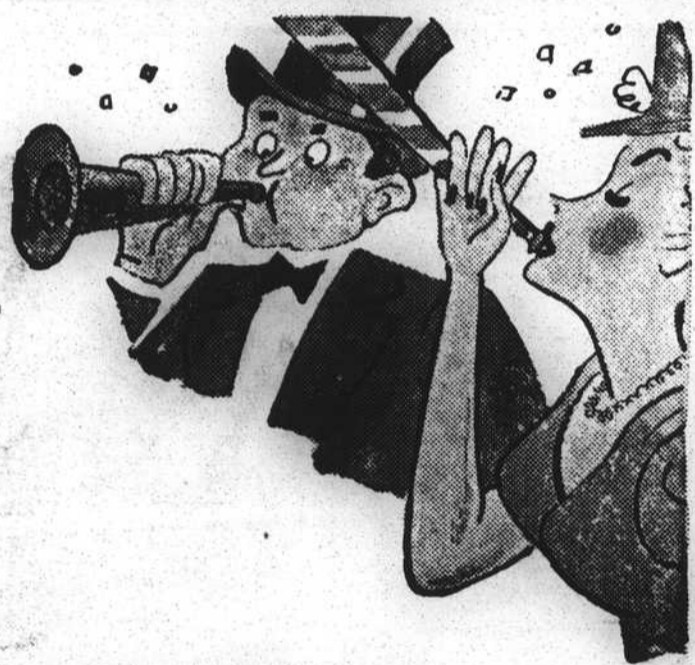
