## **Members Of Draft Board Are Given** Special Medals

Three Alleghany county men, Jones H. Waddell, Carl Douglas and Charles R. Roe, draft board officials, received recognition yesterday when Governor R. Gregg Cherry and Selective Service Director, General Van B. Metts, awarded them certificates of merit and medals for service in an impressive ceremony held in the courthouse in Winston-Salem.

They were cited along with other draft board officials that have served two years or more. The Selective Service Medal, authorized by Congress, is an award to members of draft boards that have served two years or more.

The medal has a bronze finish and on its face is the selective service system seal and the inscription, "World War II." The reverse side is inscribed: "Awarded in the name of the Congress of the United States for faithful and loyal service." A ribbon bar and a lapel pin accompany each me-

The national ceremony for the 54 state and territorial representatives was held in Washington on Monday.
