A workstock clinic for the treatment of horses and mules for botts, will be held in Alleghany county under the supervision of Dr. S. G. Eddins, vetinerian of Galax, Va., from February 18 through 25, R. E. Black, county agent announced this

Mr. Black pointed out that a schedule had been worked out for the clinic, but that farmers wishing to do so could bring their stock out to the highway between stops on the designated schedule where it would be more convenient. Both the bott and round worm treatment will be given for \$1.00, it was explained.

Mr. Black also reminded farmers that horses may have water but no feed for twelve to eighteen hours before the treatment
