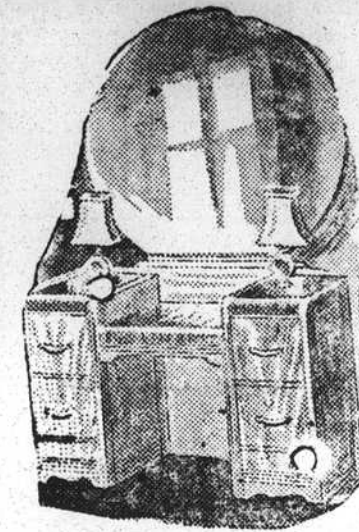
## AUG. 4 SET FOR SERVICE

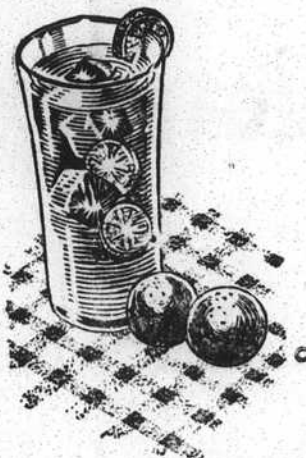
