Oct. 26-Nov. 2 Is Set As Apple Week

"In these days of acute shortages, it is comforting to know that one inexpensive, nutritious food is plentiful." M. E. Gard-ner, head of the horticulture department at State College in making this statement adds that a special week, October 26-November 2, has been set aside in recognition of this fact.

Naming Hallowe'en, October 31, as Apple Day, the International Apple Association has revived an old custom which lay dormant during the war years in re-estabishing National Apple Week.

He emphasizes that apples may be used in a number of ways in cooking to stretch what otherwise might be skimpy menus due to the severe food shortages this fall.


