New Ceiling On Sugar Is Given

# Uniform Retail Prices Are To Be Effective In North Carolina New

Raleigh—Uniform retail ceal-ing prices on sugar will become effective in North Carolina to-day, William A. Linehan, branch office director of the U. S. De-partment of Agriculture's sugar rationing administration, an-

nounced. The ceiling prices for North Carolina are: granulated cane sugar, bulk, 11 cents per pound in group I stores, 10 in group II stores; granulated cane, in five-pound, factory-packed paper bag, group II, 51 cents; granulated cane in 10-pound, factory-packed paper bags, \$1.06 per bag in group I, group II, \$1.01; powdered sugar, 4-X, in one-pound cartons, 12 cents in group I, 11 cents in group II; brown sugar, in one-pound cartons, group I, 12 cents, pound cartons, group I, 12 cents, group II, 11 cents.

At the same time, Linehan announced that restaurants, hotels, hospitals and other institutional users would receive increased sugar allotments averaging 25 per cent for the May-June period.
