states roughly will receive 10 per cent less than for the year ending July 1, Department of Agriculture experts said.

All school lunch funds must go for food, Congress having refused to add anything for equipment. The estimated school lunch fund allocation included:

Farm tenant purchase loans for 1947-48 will be distributed on the basis of a 1946 farm census. Previous allotments were made on the 1946 census. The allocation formula gives weight to total farm, population and the percentage of tenancy in the individual states.
