At Home On The Farm With The City Cousin

"Don't tell me, John, that 'like is comin' down here to North Carolina to speak to the farm people!" "It's a fact, Cousin," John Waggoner tells me the other day when I ran into him over in Greensboro. He's the Guilford County agent for the State College Extension Service, and we got to talkin' about Farm and Home Week—that cross between a state fair, a week's vacation, and a college education they have every year at State College. They tell me this is the fortieth year the state's farmers and their wives have spent a week on the college visitin'—and hearin' and seein' the latest agricultural developments—and sittin' for a while now and then to hear some one from Washington or Georgia or elsewhere tell them how they fit into the broad picture of events that's shaping the world. Now, I haven't been to all forty of these weeks, but I've made it a point lately to try to get around to the campus and see the exhibits and visit old friends like Jack Weaver over in Eagle-rock County who have made farming and homemaking mean so much to me. But I was surprised and more pleased to hear from Agent Waggoner that the nation's top military officer—who led the mighty invasion to free all of Europe from Nazi tyranny—would be on hand when Farm and Home Week rolls around the 25th of this month for five big days and nights. "Wonder what General Eisenhower'll have to say, John?" "I've seen a copy of the program," he says, "and they've got him down to speak in Riddick Stadium at eight o'clock Thursday night—that's the 28th—but it doesn't say what he'll talk about." Then I got to thinkin' about some of the other subjects the famous and distinguished general has voiced publicly, and I recalled that he had told a group recently that the United States Army, which he heads, is second
