Firm-ripe cherries, currants, red spherries or strawberries may s used for sun-cooked preserves, herries should be washed and Cherries should be washed and seeded; currants washed and seeded; currants washed and capped. Drain and weigh the fruit. Work with small batches, using equal amounts of sugar and fruit. Place fruit and sugar in alternate layers in a broad pan. Let stand overnight. Heat slowly to boiling and boil six minutes. Spread in shallow trays and cover with window glass. Allow air space on all sides. Let the mixture stand in the sun for three days, or until the sirup begins to jell and the fruit is plump. Stir gently two or three times daily. Do not keep the mixture out of doors overnight. 
