

### Naval Statistics

Many Navy enlisted men are appointed to the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis each year.

A man enlisting in the Navy at 17 could retire when only 37, with half pay the rest of his life.

Men enlisting in the Navy now have a good chance of getting into Navy aviation.

An enlisted man in Naval aviation may serve in aircraft carriers, carrier aircraft, multi-engine patrol squadrons, sea plane tenders, or in air stations through-

out the United States and overseas.

A Navy dollar equals \$3.96 in civilian pay today. Any Navy Recruiter has the details.

Men 17 and under 31 can earn in the Navy the equivalent of \$82.40 a week. Navy Recruiters have the details.

Recently, 300 men with Navy electronics training were hired by private industry at salaries averaging \$7,000 a year.

### Corn Relish—Recipe for a Popular Hostess

Corn relish is one of those appetizing dishes we rarely enjoy unless we know someone who does home canning and invites us over for a meal. Popular hostesses find that it pays to include corn relish in their home canning plans. The Ball Blue Book recipe for this taste treat is as follows:

2 quarts corn  
1 quart chopped cabbage  
1 cup green sweet pepper  
1 cup sweet red pepper  
2 large onions  
1 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons ground mustard  
1 tablespoon mustard seed  
1 tablespoon salt  
1 tablespoon celery seed  
1 quart vinegar  
1 cup water

Boil corn five minutes. Cold dip. Cut from cob. Measure. Chop and measure cabbage and peppers. Chop onions. Combine ingredients and simmer 20 minutes. (More salt and sugar may be added if needed.) Pack into hot jars. Seal at once.

### Can Pickled Crab Apples for Your Winter Meals

Just the thing to serve with a rich roast of meat or fowl are Crab Apple Pickles. Several jars should be canned for use with winter meals, when heavy foods are needed. This recipe comes from the universally used Ball Blue Book on home canning:

1 gallon crab apples  
6 to 8 cups sugar  
3 cups water  
4 cups vinegar  
1 stick cinnamon  
1 tablespoon crushed ginger  
1 tablespoon whole allspice  
1/2 teaspoon whole cloves

Wash apples and pierce each with a needle. Heat sugar, liquids and spices (tied in bag) until sugar dissolves. Cool. Add apples and simmer until tender. Let stand several hours or overnight. Pack cold apples into hot jars. Boil the sirup to the desired thickness and pour over apples. Process five minutes in hot water bath. The amount of sugar may vary depending upon whether a fairly sweet or moderately sour pickle is desired, and from one-half to one-third of it may be corn sirup.

### Veteran's Question Box

**Q.** Is it correct that the government will guarantee up to \$4000 on a business loan under the GI bill?

**A.** T. R. J., Venice, Fla.  
A. It is correct if the business loan is for the purchase of business real-estate property, but if the loan is for non-real-estate property such as stock or equipment, the maximum guarantee cannot be more than \$2000.

**Q.** I have been drawing \$57.50 each month from my \$10,000 war risk insurance policy since my discharge from the army after World War I. What I want to know is, are such payments discontinued when the \$10,000 is exhausted? — S. H., Harrisburg, Pa.

**A.** No. Veterans administration says that payments may be continued for the remainder of your life, providing your total disability remains unchanged.

**Q.** If I use part of my armed forces leave bond to pay my insurance can I receive the balance in cash? — L. C., Tell City, Ind.

**A.** No. The remainder of your bond is placed to your credit until such time as it becomes payable in cash, or you authorize further premium payments from the balance of your credit. However, the new law just signed by the president provides that you may cash your terminal leave bond after September 1, 1947.

**Q.** I am an honorably discharged World War II veteran and would like to know where I can secure specific information concerning re-adjustment allowances while I am unemployed. — C. A., Portland, Me.

**A.** You should inquire at the public employment office or at the office of the unemployment agency of the state in which you reside. In your case there is probably such an office in Portland.

**Q.** I have been having some difficulty obtaining a GI loan and one of the questions I would like to have answered is, does the veterans administration set the date for maturity on my loan? — K. L. R., Oakland, Calif.

**A.** No. Veterans administration does not set the date of maturity but the law provides the terms shall in no event exceed 30 years for non-real-estate loans, 25 years for home and business loans on real-estate, and 40 years for farm loans on real estate far-

ming operations.

**Q.** I was discharged from the army after serving 3 months on a hardship case because of the dependency of my mother. I lost my mustering-out pay and now do I lose my rights under the GI bill? I would like to enroll in a school at least part time.—Veteran, Cheyenne, Wyo.

**A.** If you are otherwise qualified, the fact that you were discharged from the service because of the dependency of your mother would not be material and you would be entitled to enter school under the GI bill.

### All Ages Thrive on Pures



Home-canned pures are excellent items to have on hand in your pantry. They're nourishing foods for infants and everyone finds them delicious served up in cream soups and souffles. A puree may be made from green peas, asparagus, lima beans, or spinach, etc. Select fresh vegetables and prepare as for cooking. Steam until soft or cook in the smallest possible amount of water. Press through a fine sieve. Add boiling water, if necessary, to make the puree about the consistency of thick cream. Do not salt pures intended for infant feeding. Use one teaspoon salt to each quart of puree to be used by adults. Re-heat to boiling and pour into hot Ball jars. Process quart jars 60 minutes at 10 pounds pressure, half-pint jars 50 minutes at the same amount of pressure.

### 5 Arrested By Local Officers

#### Bobbitt In Jail In Default Of Bond; Two Arrested For Public Drunkenness

Coy Bobbitt, 43, of near Sparta, is now being held in the county jail in default of \$1000 bond. Bobbitt, charged with incest, was arrested by officers last Thursday and was bound over to court at a hearing before Ben F. Wagoner.

Robert McKinley Williams, of Cherry Lane, charged with possession of non-tax paid liquor, was released on \$300 bond and bound over to superior court.

Two were arrested on public drunkenness charges by Chief of Police, C. B. Taylor and State Highway Patrolman, W. H. Hogan. Sam Watson, of Cherry Lane, was fined \$5 and costs before Justice Nichols, Monday. Garret Mayes, of Taylorsville, was also fined \$5 and costs.


A hearing for C. Nichols, charged with assault, has been set for September 19, before Mayor Nichols. He was released on \$200 bond.
