

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced that the Commodity Credit Corporation will buy rice on a competitive bid basis to meet export requirements.

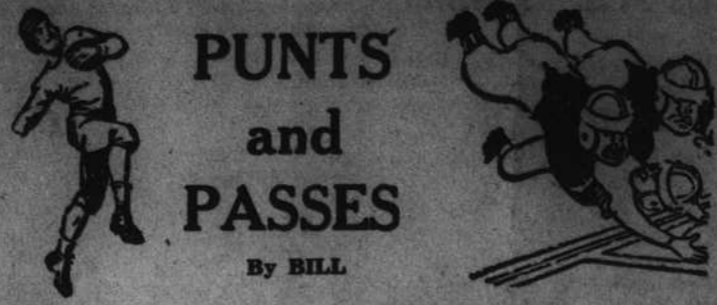

By the use of soil analysis and other conservation measures including strip cropping as a system of farming, farmers in Alleghany county are finding out that they can grow more corn on less acreage. Less acres planted to cultivated crops leaves more to pasture and permanent hay.

Soil samples were taken on several fields for M. V. Collins, of near Edmonds. Mr. Collins has some pasture land that has been left to the mercies of the rain and wind and has eroded badly. He has placed old hay and other mulching materials on these eroded spots and applied lime and fertilizer. He also seeded les-

pedeza, which has already changed the looks of his field and is furnishing some grazing.

B. H. Hector is still following his strip cropping system of farming and is pleased with it. He seeded a strip to alfalfa this fall as a further conservation measure. This permanent hay crop will furnish quality for dairy cows and will check soil erosion too.
