**Local Firemen Are Presented** With Checks For Attending Fires In 1938

The need in Valdese for a rural fire truck to help serve the suburbs in and around Valdese was stressed at the regular annual banquet of the Valdese volunteer fire department last Friday night at the Castle Cafe. Fire Chief Lee Ribet asked that influence be brought to bear on the members of the board of county commissioners to help provide for such a fire truck here in Valdese with one man in charge to answer such calls as came in.

Valdese's fine fire record was reviewed and it was found that in two and a half years the town of Valdese fire loss had not ex-

After a delightful dinner had been enjoyed by the group of firemen, city officials and business men, Francis Garrou, Jr., acting as toastmaster, introduced the guests of the evening, Bonner Lane and Ed Hern of Morganton. Mr. Hern enumerated the improvements that Morganton was undergoing towards helping its firefighting work. Expecting a bigger water supply and better equipment and that a bigger dam in the mountains would also soon
