Police Officer J. P. Stilwell arrested the young woman in Hickory Tuesday night and reported that she had in her possession two suitcases and one box filled with clothes which were identified as the property of Mrs. Berry.

The Berry home, one mile east of Valdese, was saved from destruction by fire Tuesday morning when Valdese firemen extinguished a blaze that was burning the walls and floor in the corner of a bedroom.
