LIONS CLUB CITES NEED OF QUARTERS

Sees Problem One For Entire Town To Assist In Early Solution.

The Valdese Lions Club took cognizance Thursday night at its regular bi-monthly meeting of an outstanding need of the town of Valdese that of providing suitable living quarters for the teachers in the Valdese public schools.

Going a step further, the club approved a motion to take action in the matter, and endeavor to get a committee of citizens appointed to work out a solution to the problem. The problem was deemed to be one large enough and important enough to merit consideration and aid from the entire town, rather and from all civic, as well as other organizations.

The club went on record as favoring a two-fold plan of action: (1) to take whatever measures are necessary to provide housing by the time school opens next fall and (2) to take a long range view of the matter and plan for the housing of teachers ten and fifteen years from now.

At present, the club is planning to represent the problem to other organizations, to consult with the school boards and school principals, and to try to arrive at a proper plan of procedure.

In discussing the matter, members of the Lions club agreed that the problem was not one for the school board and the school principals to solve, but one for the entire town to face, since the welfare of the entire community is endangered if Valdese cannot attract qualified teachers because of its lack of housing facilities.

But, club members agreed, they wanted to work with the school board in solving the problem. which they feel is of vital concern to all citizens who are interested in the growth of Valdese.

Leaders of the town have noted for some time that the Valdese schools are sometimes having to accept teachers with less than "A' grade teachers who might be willing to come to Valdese if they
