A LOOK AHEAD.

It is related that a crop of Sea Island cotton grown on Edisto Island, South Carolina, sold this year for 85 cents a pound in open and competitive market, whereas the ordinary Sea Island staple in the same market brought less than 40 cents a pound.

At an entertainment given by the blind Prof. Clifford, Miss Mattie Lander received a silver cup, being voted for unanimously as the prettiest girl.

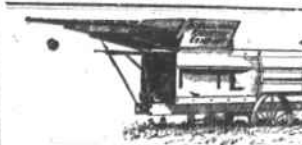
Misses Nita Hamilton and Gertrude Woodard spent the week-end at Wintedeville.
