### WHITE SLAVE BILL PASSED BY THE HOUSE.

Washington, Jan. 12.—By viva voce vote the House today passed the Bennett-Sabath "white slave bill."

The "white slave" bill is the result of an investigation of traffic in alien women, made by the National Immigration Commission. Provision is made for the deportation and exclusion of immoral aliens and for the exclusion and punishment of their procurers. Traffic in immoral women becomes subject to the restriction of interstate commerce laws.

### FIRST BLACKHAND CONVICTION IN NORTH CAROLINA.

Raleigh, N. C., Jan. 12.—John Wilkins, of Goldsboro, who wrote a blackhand letter to a merchant named Collins at Greensboro, threatening death if one hundred dollars was not placed under a railway crossing, was convicted and sentenced to fourteen months in Atlanta prison. This is the first blackhand conviction in North Carolina.

### MEAT TO GO HIGHER.

Denver, Col., Jan. 12.—Harold Swift, of Swift & Co., yesterday, in discussing the cost of living, said: "Prices of meats are very high now, but there is every indication that they will go still higher. This is attributable to the high price of corn and the consequent scarcity of live stock. As long as the scarcity continues it is well to educate people to use the cheaper cuts of meat. These cheaper cuts are just as good and more wholesome if properly prepared."

Mr. Swift admitted that the retail dealer is making a large gross profit on meat.

### NANCY M. GASKILL DEAD.

Passed Away Yesterday at Her Residence After Long Illness.

Mrs. Nancy M. Gaskill, wife of Mr. Walter Gaskill, died at her residence yesterday morning. At the time of her death she was in her forty-second year. She had been a great sufferer. She was a woman highly esteemed. Mrs. Gaskill was a devoted wife and affectionate mother. The funeral took place this morning and the interment was in Oakdale cemetery. The Daily News expresses sympathy.

### NORFOLK SCHOONER SUNK.

Highland Light, Mass., Jan. 12.—It was fortunate that the schooner S. M. Bird, Norfolk for Boston, with coal, was near Pollock Point lightship last night when she sprung a leak and sank, for the crew and the captain's wife were enabled to reach the lightship after a short but hard row in their yawl boat.

Today the revenue cutter Gresham came along and taking off all hands, started for Provincetown.

The S. M. Bird registered 430 tons.

### NOTED MOONSHINER PLEADED GUILTY.

Raleigh, N. C., Jan. 13.—In the Federal court today Eben Cagle of Rockingham county, known as the King of Moonshiners, and for eight years had been sought by revenue officers, pleaded guilty and was given twelve months sentence in the Atlanta penitentiary.
