The Auditor should be made busi ness manager of the county and he be held directly responsible to the Board for his acts, in a bond of sufficient amount to guarantee the proper conduct of the office. He should not be permitted to engage in Cor. Main & Market Sts. other business and should be paid a salary sufficient to secure his entire

Under our present system no individual is directly responsible for the business management of county affairs, therefore, it is left open for speculation and as a rule the county pays high prices for what it buys


