MONTANA BANKERS IN SESSION. Park Seats to Make Money. San Jose, Cal., is trying in its park a bench devised by E. W. Allen for use in connection with the free seats. It is a swinging seat so arranged that until a nickel is deposited in a slot, the back is tilted forward and the seat downward, so that it can not be used. A coin releases it, however, and provides a rocking seat for two persons. As soon as they leave the seat swings back to its former position, and requires another nickel to unlock it. In sunny places the bench is placed under a canopy. The inventor believes that on Sundays and other times, when there are unusual crowds in the park, many people will be willing to spend a nickel for a comfortable seat for their exclusive use.—The Survey.
