Orchard and Garden.

A neglected asparagus bed on the place is of little commercial value, and to take to the old crowns and reset them would be unwise when young plants can be obtained at a moderate cost and a new bed planted at much less expense.

Save all of the wood shavings and sawdust from the sawmill. They are very rich in nitrogen, and a necessary element of fertility. In addition to the plant food value of pebbles, they furnish the acid which is a condition of the soil, making it fertile and friable.
