Since, to a degree, simplicity is the  
rule this season, many of the well-cut  
designs, showing long, straight lines,  
are equally as appropriate for after-  
noon teas and matinees as for street  
wear. A fact that makes for economy  
and a saving of time as well.

The lines of the "new" figure show a  
more or less of a slope to the shoulders  
and broad lines in waist and hips and  
often at the knees. 7789 and 7719 is es-  
pecially suited to these lines, showing,  
as it does, the drop-shoulder and a  
slight fullness at the waist. A bit of  
drapery on each side of the skirt is  
modish and graceful.

The frilling of net flaring in the neck  
and the diagonal closing of the blouse  
is another effective touch.

One of those quaintly figured stuffs  
that, fairly "make" a gown is used  
here. The design could also be fash-  
ioned of one of the modish velours or  
rattines, effectively. A figured char-  
meuse or a brocaded satin are also  
good suggestions if the frock is intend-  
ed solely for afternoons. An attractive,  
folded giraffe in a bright, harmonious  
shade and an inset of the same satin  
at the bottom of the skirt are individ-  
ual notes that give distinction.

**THE INCREASING POPULARITY OF

Especially suited to these skirts are

in weight and add greatly in bringing

**SAHARA MAY BE RECLAIMED**

No Obstacle There That Modern En-  
gineering Art Could Not Easily  
Overcome, Says Expert.

"In the popular mind the reclama-  
tion of the desert of Sahara is re-  
garded as one of the most monumen-  
tal tasks which could be undertaken,  
but, as a matter of fact, it is quite  
simple," said a well-known engineer  
who has just returned from abroad.

"It is a much simpler project than  
the draining and irrigation of Upper  
Egypt, which has been recently ac-  
complished by the English govern-  
ment. The Sahara was once a fertile  
spot, covered with large rivers, and  
part of the scheme contemplates the  
abandonment of these old river beds,  
abandoned by nature, for the purpose  
of again conveying the water which  
is rejuvenate this desolate area. By  
the erection of a dam at Tossaye it is  
proposed to catch the summer over-  
flow of the Niger and to irrigate the  
district between Timbuctu and Ara-  
wan, and the restoration of this dis-  
trict will offer encouragement for the  
construction of a railroad through it,  
whereupon the present traffic of the  
River Senegal will be taken over by  
the railroad, and then it will be feasi-  
ble to make use of the Senegal for  
irrigation. It is proposed eventually  
to extend the railroad across the con-  
tinent and make connections with the  
line which is now pushing its way  
northerly from one end of Africa to  
the other."
