RAILROAD NOTES.

The Chicago, Burlington and Quincy reports a big reduction in labor cost for conducting transportation over its lines.

The Boardman Chamber of Deputies has unanimously voted a credit of \$75,700,000 for an extensive scheme of railroad construction.

A merry war is anticipated between the Interstate Commerce Commission and the Louisville and Nashville Railroad as a result of the latter's attorney's refusal to open his files to the commission's examiners.

It is estimated that the Baltimore & Ohio railroad has been losing almost a million dollars a month during the past three months and for that reason great reductions are being made in expenditures of money. Many employees are being laid off until conditions improve.
