In this way teachers will be given an opportunity to attend the Institute at a minimum cost, which will probably not exceed three or four dollars a week. Teachers will bring their books used in the public schools, also O'Rhea's "Everyday Problems in Teaching."  
The Institute for colored teachers will be held in the graded school building (colored).  
A large attendance at this Institute is expected since the teachers of Pitt, Hyde and Beaufort will combine and attend at Washington.

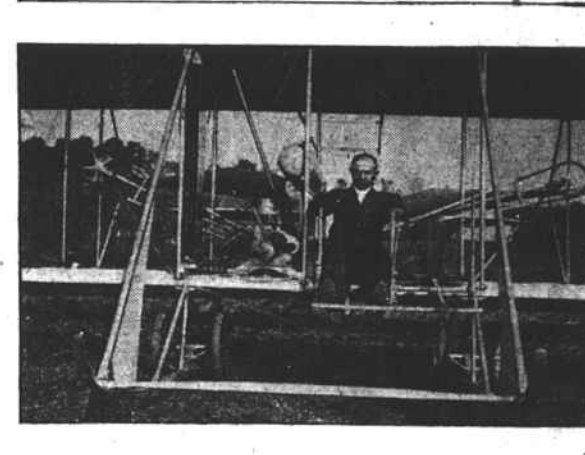
