Isouis, June 15 .- Hyphenated organizations will be denounced vigorously in the Democratic platform The President's ideas on internation al relations, Mexico and suffrage will dominate the platform. A tentative draft was brought to St. Louis today by Secretary of War Baker, giving Mr. Wilson's views. It touches only the high spots, leaving the minor issues to be worked out by the reso-

hutons committee. An outline of the platform may be given as follows: the denucla-tion of hyphenates, the urging of true Americanism, the endorsement of suffrage, the demand of a navy sufficient for protection, an army of sufficient strength to form the nucleus of a fighting force, the income tax, a scientific tariff commission and a low tariff. Referring to Mexico, the President states that weaker nations ought to have the right to shape their own destinies. To Speed Up Convention.
