CHICAGO LOOKS FOR EMBARGO ON WHEAT EXPORTS

Chicago, Sept. 12.—An embargo on the exportation of wheat from the United States may be declared in the near future, according to experts. This would mean a lowering of prices in North America as well as elsewhere.

The quality of the wheat now being harvested is poor. Prominent millers say that while under ordinary conditions it requires four and one-half bushels of wheat to make a barrel of flour, it will now require a much larger amount because of the inferior wheat. The quality is below normal in the great fields of the Northwest, and in the winter wheat belt much lightweight grain has been threshed.

RUSSIA FACES MEAT FAMINE

Berlin, Sept. 12.—Unofficial reports to the Overseas News Agency say the sale of meat is forbidden throughout Russia on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Other foods, especially vegetables and fruit, have risen in price, in some cases 100 per cent.

"All persons whose presence in Petrograd is not absolutely necessary will be deported," says a Stockholm dispatch. It adds that there is famine throughout Russia.

THREATEN TO BLOW UP DIPPING VATS

(New Bern Sun Journal)
