NORFOLK-SOUTHERN WILL SELL OFF ITS SURPLUS LAND

The management of the Norfolk Southern Railroad Company has recently decided to place on the market for sale all real estate owned by the Company that will not be needed in the future development of its property. As the lines of that company have been extended and developed from year to year numerous tracts and parcels of land have been acquired, the retention of which, owing to changed conditions, is no longer necessary. The company's future policy will be to dispose of this property as promptly as it can be sold at a fair price and devote the proceeds to the betterment and improvement of the railroad. In some towns along the line of its road the Company owns nearly every other lot.

The sale of the property has been placed in the hands of M. S. Hawkins, assistant to President, Norfolk, Virginia.

Local Boy at El Paso States That Paper is Read With Keen Interest Among Soldiers.

This is the message contained in a letter which was received this morning from Frazier McDevitt, a local boy, who is now with the North Carolina militia on the border. In the letter, Frazier also states that there is usually "a scrap" between Dr. A. K. Taylor and Colonel Rodman and some of the other officers over who gets the Daily News first and that it is even worse with the non-commissioned officers and privates. Washington is represented by about twelve men on the border.

BAYONNE STRIKERS HAVE STARTED WORK

New York, Oct. 21.—By almost unanimous vote the Bayonne strikers decided last night to return to work. A little hissing at the mass meeting in Mydoah's Hall marked the finish of the 1916 struggle of the Standard Oil Company employes for changed conditions. All of the 1,200 men packed into the small hall accepted the decree. The men will return to work today, leaving the question of wages and working conditions to be determined by the two Federal mediators now in Bayonne. "Quiet and peace! That is what we want," cried Martin Karetzky, member of the strike committee, at a moment when the massed strikers seemed to hesitate. Nearly 12,000 men will return to the plants this morning as the outcome of the meeting last night. Only 4,500 of these were actual strikers.
