BAYONNE STRIKERS

New York Oct. 21 -- By almost unanimous vote the Bayonne strikers decided last night to return to work.

A little hissing at the mass meetng in Mydosh's Hall marked inish of the 1916 struggle of the Standard Oil Company employes for changed conditions. All of the 1,200 cepted the decree. The men will return to work today, leaving the question of wages and working con-ditions to be determined by the two Federal mediators now in Bayonne.

"Quiet and peace! That is what we want," cried Martin Karetzky, member of the strike committee, at a moment when the massed strikers

4,500 of these were setual strikers.
