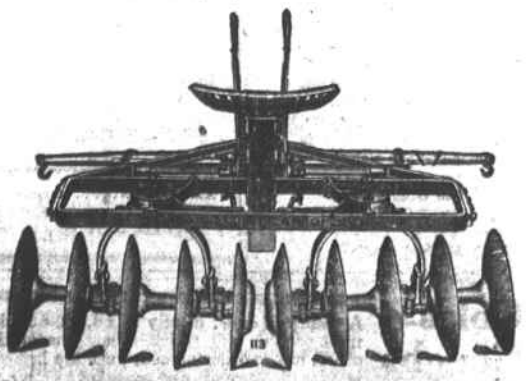

To the Farmers of Beaufort County: I am publishing Prof. Logan's letter as matter of information for you. Prof. C. C. Logan is in the U. S. Extension service in the South—soil survey work. He came to our experiment station at Raleigh from the Illinois experiment station where he has had experience in soils, soil fertility, and soils survey work for sixteen years. He is to be with me in his county one week beginning December 4th. Our plans are to hold eight meetings through the week at the school houses mentioned below and to do field work during the day. At the night meetings Prof. Logan will lecture on soil fertility, soil acidity, soil management and his soil survey work generally. The field work will be the taking of specimens of soils from the different farms we may visit for analysis also to analyze specimen of lime or marl, etc.

This will be an opportunity for you to have your soil analyzed that will probably not come again for a long time. I trust every farmer in the county will attend at least one of these meetings which are to be as follows:

- Aurora Monday night, Dec. 4.
- Old Ford Tuesday night, Dec. 5.
- Surry, Wednesday night, Dec. 6.
- Winsteadville, Thursday night, Dec. 7.
- Latham's school house (near Acrc Chapel) Friday night, Dec. 8.
