Casings Must Be Marked at Plant

Be Printed Plainly On Meat Casings Before They Are Stuffed

Housewives will be able to read required governmental markings on colored artificial casings for meat products more easily after October 1, 1935.

J. R. Mohler, Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry, United States Department of Agriculture, has notified meat inspectors and packers that required Government markings must be printed plainly on such casings before they are stuffed with sausage or other meat product. This instruction, issued recently under the Federal Meat Inspection 'Act, applies to all colored artificial casings as they cannot be successfully marked with branding fluid after filling. Such brands on colored casings do not show up plainly and may be obscured in handling.

The Federal inspection legened, establishment number, name of product when required, and other markings as "imitation," "artifically colored", "cereal added," and "dried skimmed milk added," must be conspicuously printed on that type of casing.
