Although sugar syrup and extracted honey may take the place of straight honey in the comb as bee feed, no satisfactory substitute for pollen essential for brood rearing has yet been found.

Some unusually prudent bees may put away large supplies of pollen, often covering it with honey and sealing the cells to prevent drying or mold attack.

Putting some of this reserve within easy reach of bees in colonies without pollen stores strengthens the colonies as a whole.
