

# County Grand Jury Object Of Much Criticism In State

The Columbus county grand jury, which last week adjourned here without making any indictments in the widely publicized flogging incidents, and without mentioning their two-day investigation ordered by Judge Barnhill, is coming in for bitter denunciations from the press over the state.

The investigating body, in the opinion of the High Point Enterprise, "if not friends of the unknown floggers, came from the same section, were bred to the same environment . . . so why must we make a mystery out of the breakdown of the flogging case investigation?" But, to quote an editorial

extract from the Raleigh News & Observer last Thursday "Four women who came to testify before it (the grand jury) as victims of the floggings, have been indicted on charges of immorality and will be promptly tried. Not being able to catch the wolves, the Columbus grand jury has caught the lambs—though soiled lambs they may be. This process goes under the name of justice".

More scathing in its condemnation of the grand jury's lack of action was the Greensboro Daily News, which concluded "Night ride all you please, as the matter now stands; but if you wish to be indicted just be the victim of a flogging band."
