at on this short course which will instruct farmers in the growing

of a better quality of leaf. Specialists from the State College of Agriculture, the Extension Service, and the Experiment Station will lead group discussions in all phases of tobacco growing and marketing, from the time the seed are set out in plant beds to the time the weed is sold on warehouse floors.

Those in charge of the course are confident that farmers will welcome such a meeting and that improvements in the crop will be seen next year and in future years as a result of the instruction.
