

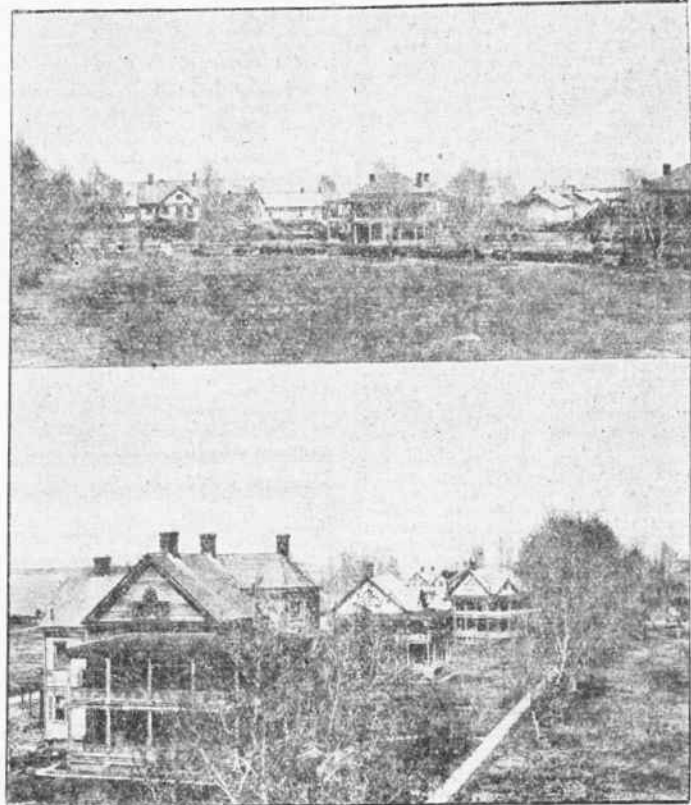

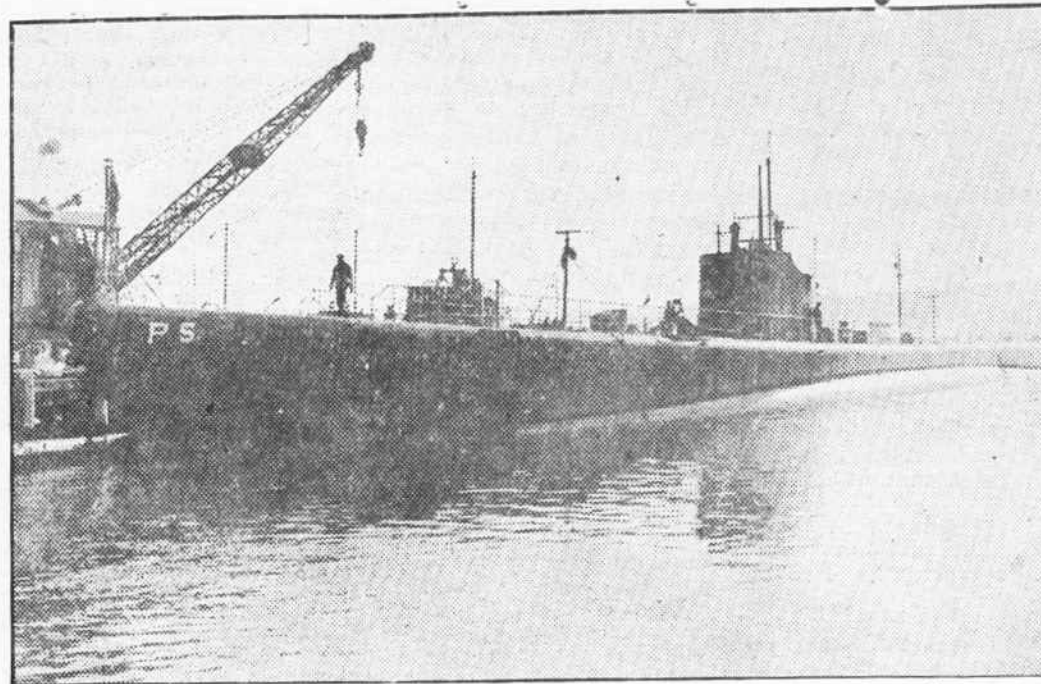


W. B. Keziah, secretary of the Southport Civic Club, thinks Brunswick county has a lot of wonderful resources and his organization is doing its best to develop them.

Above is the first picture ever taken of the United States Submarine PERCH which is to arrive at Southport January 14th, at 10 o'clock. Picture was taken at dock at New London, Conn. The ship is 300 feet long and is brand new. This will be her first friendly call at any port, likewise she will, when she reaches Southport, have the distinction of being the first U. S. Submarine that has ever visited in North Carolina waters.

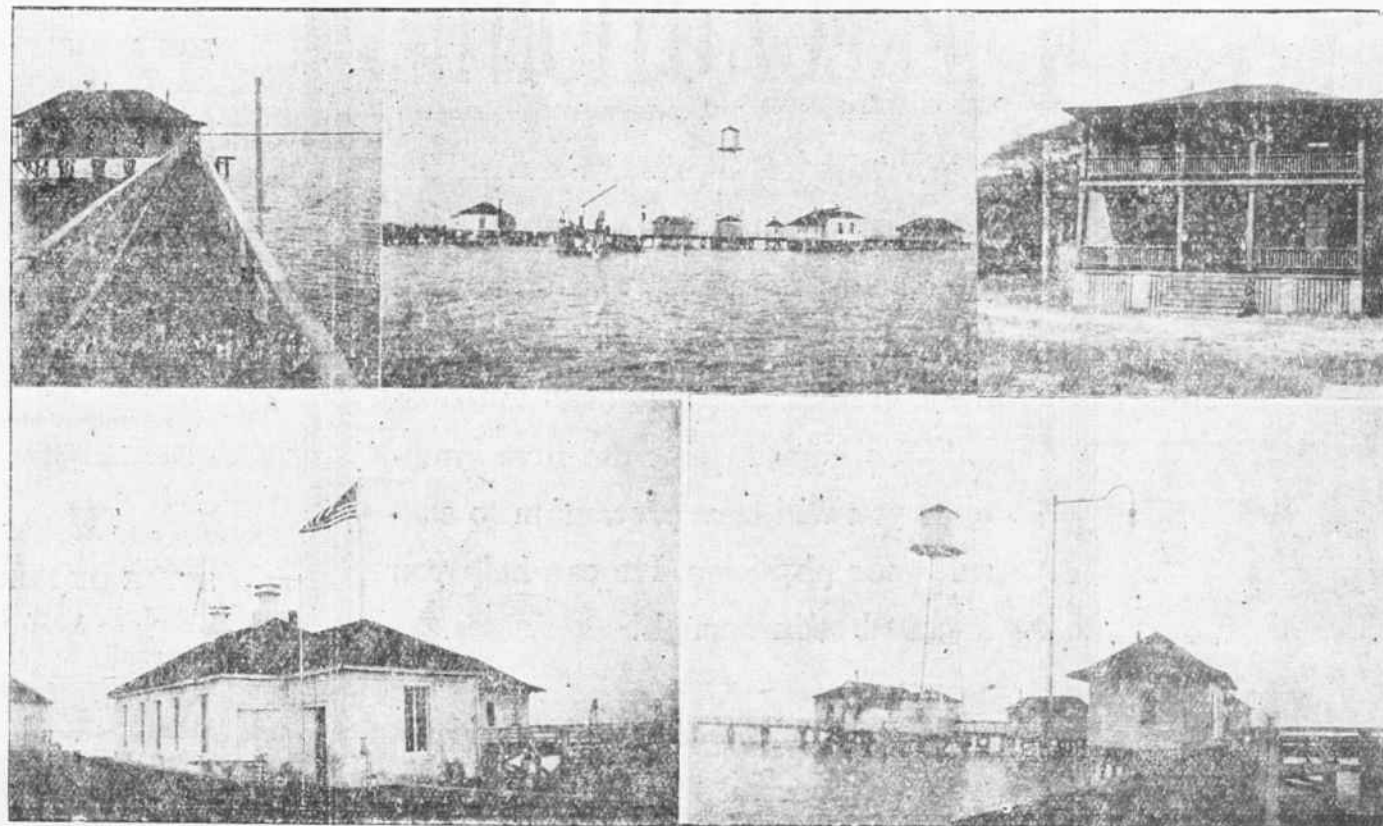

Quarantine Station Guards Citizens Of N. C. Against Pestilence



Above are shown several views of the local Quarantine Station, situated on the east side of the Cape Fear River channel about a mile and one-half above Southport. At the left is the contagious hospital; in the center is a distant view of the entire station; at the right is the shore station.
