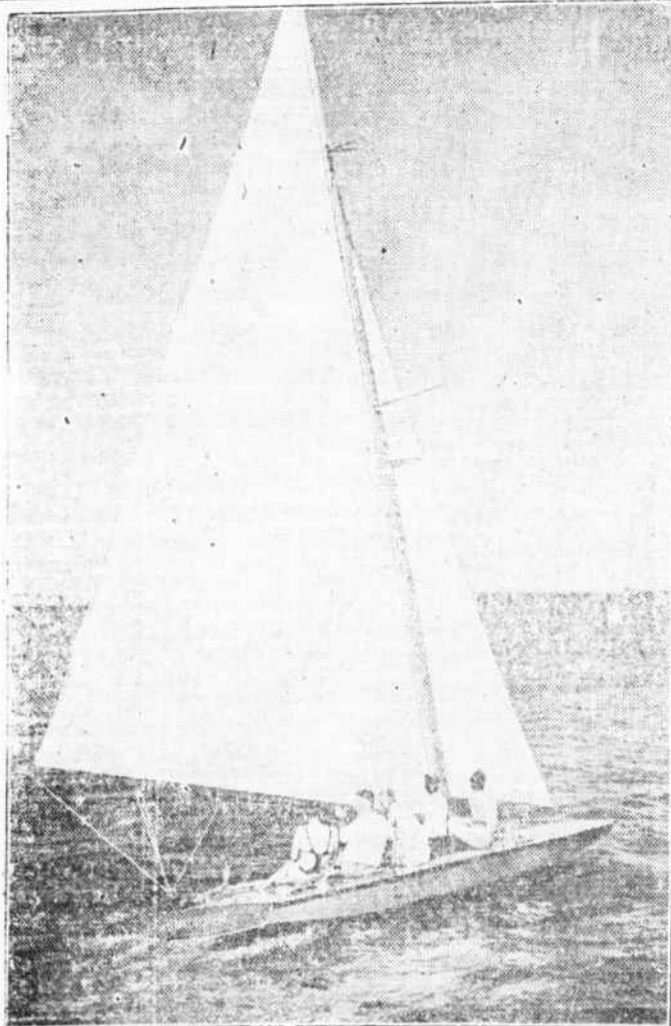

Declares "Dog Days" Not Time When Most Canines Take Rabies

Raleigh, August 7.—The so-called "dog days" of July and August do not constitute the period in which dogs "go mad" or develop rabies, it was announced here by Dr. Roy Norton, assistant director of the Division of Preventive Medicine, State Board of Health, following a close study of a 5-year compilation made by Dr. John H. Hamilton, director of the Division of Laboratories. It was also brought out that not nearly all the heads examined at State Laboratory of Hygiene, operated by the Board of Health, show positive results.

Hutson Discusses Farm Program

The ideal farm program under the AAA would be one confined to educational work and soil conservation but in actual experience such a program is inadequate. This is the opinion of J. E. Hutson, assistant administrator of the Agricultural Adjustment Administration, who spoke twice last week before delegates attending the 34th annual Farm and Home Week exercises at State College.

Badly Handicapped

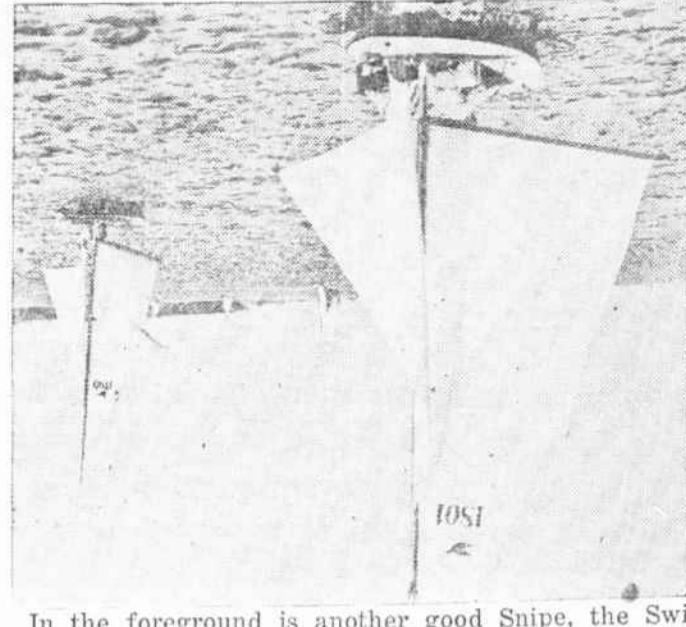
