through the contribution of the  
readers. If you have a relative  
or neighbor in one of the  
above named services, how  
about dropping us a card, or  
mailing a letter, telling where  
he is, what is his rank and in  
which branch of service he is  
engaged.

Do this today. It makes no  
difference if there are duplicate  
reports on the same person, for  
they will be compared and pro-  
perly eliminated. The impor-  
tant thing is to obtain the name  
and classification of every pa-  
triotic Brunswick county man  
now serving in one of Uncle  
Sam's armed services.

We feel that every American  
citizen is thinking much today  
of what he can do to show that  
he is a loyal patriot.

May we commend the local  
citizen in our town, who ex-  
pressed his patriotism in a very  
definite way a few days ago;  
when he stood at attention and  
watched that flag being raised  
on one of our buildings. We hope  
that many of us will have an  
occasion to see that and many  
other flags raised and will pause  
and also salute.

The Major General Robert  
Howe Chapter, D. A. R. feels  
that now is a most fitting time  
to concentrate our thoughts on  
our flag. Will you think with us  
now before Nov. 11th?

Some cautions:  
Do not permit disrespect to be  
shown to the flag of the United  
States of America.  
Do not dip the flag of the  
United States of America to any  
person or anything. The regimental  
color, State flag, organization,  
or institutional flag will render  
this honor.

Do not display the flag with  
the union down except as a signal  
of distress.  
Do not place any other flag or  
pennant above, or, if on the same  
level, to the right of the flag of  
the United States of America.

Do not let the flag touch the  
ground or the floor or trail in  
the water.  
Salute to the Flag:  
During the ceremony of hoist-  
ing or lowering the flag or when  
the flag is passing in a parade  
or in a review, all persons pre-  
sent should face the flag, stand  
at attention, and salute. Those  
present in uniform should remove  
the headress with the right hand  
and hold it at the left shoulder,  
the hand being over the heart.  
Women should salute by placing  
the right hand over the heart.  
The salute to the flag in the mov-  
ing column is rendered at the mo-  
ment the flag passes.

Salute to National Anthem:  
When the National Anthem is  
played and the flag is not dis-  
played, all present should stand  
and face toward the music. Those  
in uniform should salute at the  
first note of the Anthem, re-

TREMENDOUS VOTE

Victorious Democrats Cele-

man of the Brunswick county  
board of elections, Thursday fol-  
lowing a canvass of the votes.

In no case was there a cor-  
rection affecting the outcome of  
a race, and almost without ex-  
ception, the totals in the official  
table (printed elsewhere in to-  
day's paper) are greater than  
those which appeared in the un-  
official table printed last week.

President Roosevelt's majority  
over Wendell L. Willkie turned  
out to be the greatest scored by  
any candidate over his opponent.  
Mr. Roosevelt's vote was 2717 to  
1522 for Willkie. The narrowest

### Proclaim Nov. 28 As Thanksgiving

RALEIGH.—Governor Hoye to-  
day proclaimed Thursday, Novem-  
ber 28, as Thanksgiving day in  
North Carolina, setting the date  
a week later than the time desig-  
nated by President Roosevelt.

Pointing out that George Wash-  
ington called for the new nation  
in 1789 to assemble on the last  
Thursday in November for a day  
of Thanksgiving, the Governor  
reviewed the tradition of the ob-  
servance, and said:

"In this hour of international  
crisis, and amid the wreckage  
and devastation wrought by war  
in so many parts of the world,  
the people of peaceful America  
should welcome the opportunity  
to observe Thanksgiving day this  
year wholeheartedly and with a  
finer sense of appreciation of the  
gracious gifts of a divine providence  
to our favored land.
