They are not found anywhere in North Carolina except on the coast of Brunswick county, and they can apparently swim under water for miles. When near people and not exactly frightened, they swim with only about three inches of head showing. Under such circumstances, the person who is not wise to the gird will feel sure stead of a glossy black water

turkey. It was thought locally that the water turkey or if you prefer it, snakebird, confined itself to salt water, with forays on shore. They nest on shore like other birds. But the nests are seldom, if ever found. This theory of the thing being entirely a salt water critter was dispelled this past Sun-
