it was obvious that the new registrants who had received relatively low order numbers would be classified sooner than those who had received the higher numbers.

"I'd like to stress the fact again," said Director Metts, "that there isn't any difference between treatment of the new registrant and the old registrants in any respect whatsoever. They are treated exactly alike. The same rules of deferment apply to both. Both have the same right of appeal. The interests of both are protected by the government in the same manner. And each case is considered individually when the registrant's order number comes up, regardless of whether he registered July 1 or previously."

Sarah Lockwood, died September 26, 1876, age 3 years; Emma Josephine Lockwood, died September 26, 1876, aged 5 years; Marion Woodlock, died September 28, 1876, aged 10 years; John Woodlock, died October 30, 1876."

It may be noted in the above that the death of the two first named children occurred on the same date, that the Woodlock child died two days later and that John Woodlock, whose age is not given on the tombstone, died a month later. The murdered persons may have been the two Lockwood children and Marion Woodlock may have been so badly hurt at the time that she died two days afterwards, accounting for the three murders in Captain Swann's story.

There is nothing about the gravestone of John Woodlock to indicate his age, but his grave is considerably larger than the others. He may have been a father or brother of one of the murder victims.
