Tapeworms and typhoid are causing farmers of Pasquotank County to lose chickens in considerable numbers, reports Fleet D. Allen, assistant farm agent of the N. C. State College Extension Service.

The lespedeza crop of Stanly County is looking unusually good, and farmers are well pleased with prospects for hay and seed this fall, reports V. A. Huneycutt, assistant farm agent.

Demands for the service of the Cabarrus County terracing unit increase each year, with enough work booked now to keep the outfit busy for the next three months.

Black Shank, a serious tobacco disease, has broken out in many new places in Pitt County this year, reports S. J. Weeks, assistant farm agent of the N. C. State College Extension Service.

Cash income from American farm marketings totaled \$1,059,000,000 in June as compared with \$993,000,000 in May and \$773,000,000 in June of 1941, reports the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

To conserve more rubber the WPB has provided more stringent specifications which will limit the amount of rubber available for a long list of civilian products. The domestic wheat supply for 1942-43 marketing year is indicated at 1,524,000,000 bushels, or around 190,000,000 bushels above the record 1,331,000,000 bushels in 1941-42.

Domestic consumer demand for farm products will continue to rise during the next few months, predict economists of the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Cotton and paper makers hope to supply the need for new bags while no burlap — or the jute from which it is made — can come from India, largest supply source before the war.

Supplies of fresh vegetables for market continue more abundant this year than last, with the harvest expected to be 9 percent greater than in 1941.
