

#### WORMY PIG WILL NEVER GET BIG

The old saying, "A wormy pig will never get big," should be kept in mind this spring as thousands of new pigs are born, reports Dr. C. D. Grinnells, Experiment Station Veterinarian at N. C. State College. The roundworm or ascarid, is one of the most common and injurious of these swine parasites.

To raise pigs that develop quickly and profitably, he urges that growers adopt an approved swine sanitation system. This includes the removal of all little from the farrowing pens and cleaning of the pens with boning Monday, March 15th, 9:00 am. m to 5. p. m.

Smithville and Lockwoods Folly Townships: Wed, March 17th, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

### Shallotte and Waccamaw Townships: Friday, March 19th, 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m.
