

### Fishing Season Open On Easter

#### Easter Sunday And Monday Declared Open Dates By Commissioner Of Inland Fisheries

According to announcement by Hinton James, commissioner for the Bureau of Inland Fisheries, the North Carolina closed season on freshwater fishing will be lifted Easter Sunday and Easter Monday.

After these two days of grace the 40-day closed season to allow the fish to spawn will again become effective. The season will reopen on May 20th to remain open until the first of next April.

There is no closed season for freshwater fishing in commercial waters, and this leaves Brunswick river open for sportsmen. On two days last week sportsmen from Northwest township reported a fine catch of bass from this stream.

Middleton, et al., -V- Wilmington, Brunswick & Southern Railroad Company, at the February 15th, Special Term, 1943, the undersigned E. F. Middleton, Receiver, will offer for sale to the highest bidder, at the Court House door in Southport, N. C., on the 24th day of May, 1943, the entire properties, real and personal of said Wilmington, Brunswick & Southern Railroad Co., in the following manner, to-wit:

- 1st. The entire Railroad property, consisting of road bed, rights-of-way, sidings, spurs, fixtures, appliances, including locomotive, cars, coaches, franchises, etc., also certain Buses, Trucks, etc., now operated by the Receiver from Wilmington, N. C., to Southport, N. C., with State Franchise for operating the same: the sale of said Railroad being subject to the rights of A.C.L. Railroad Co., M. J. Corbett and others in and to certain railroad iron which belongs to them, and has been operated by the W. B. & S. RR. Co. under leases; all of which will be explained at the sale.
