Civilians will have more fresh fruits and vegetables in December and slightly more turkey than last month but the prospects for poultry, other meats and dairy products are less promising.

1945 Tax Listing NOTICE

LIST YOUR REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY

All property owners and tax payers are required by law to return to the List Takers for Taxation for the year 1945, all the Real Estate, Personal Property, Etc., which they own on the first day of January.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years must list for Poll Tax during the same time, except those exempt by law for physical disability.

All persons to whom the foregoing applies who fail to list their Real and Personal Property, and/or Poll Tax will be guilty of a Misdemeanor and subject to a fine or imprisonment upon conviction.

LOCAL LIST TAKERS WILL POST NOTICES OF APPOINTMENTS IN PUBLIC PLACES—WATCH FOR SAME

The Board of Equalization and Review will meet at the Tax Office at Southport on March 19th, 1945. Any complaint about valuation should be taken before the Board at that time.
