who may have otherwise acquired them the National Firearms act makes it mandatory that such weapons be registered with the Commissioner of Internal Revenue, at Washington, D. C. Guns which must be registered are of the automatic type, such as machine guns, sub-machine guns, or any type of gun from which a number of shots or bullets may be fired with one continuous pull of the trigger. 1946 Tax Listing NOTICE

LIST YOUR REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY

All property owners and tax payers are required by law to return to the List for Taxation for the year 1946, all the Real Estate, Personal Property, Etc., which they own on the first day of January.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years must list for Poll Tax at the same time, except those exempt by law for physical disability.

All persons to whom the foregoing applies who fail to list their Real and Personal Property, and/or Poll Tax will be guilty of a Misdemeanor and subject to a fine or imprisonment upon conviction.

LOCAL LIST TAKERS WILL POST NOTICE OF APPOINTMENTS IN PUBLIC PLACES—WATCH FOR SAME

The Board of Equalization and Review will meet at the Tax Office at Southport on March 18, 1946. Any complaint about valuation should be taken before the Board at that time.
