swore that Ewing, who was also there, was in a drunken condition and that he frequently slapped his wife and struck her, even after he was told she was dying.

A maid entering a room at the Ewing home had found Ewing asleep in a chair and his wife lying on the floor in an unconscious condition. She was immediately removed to the hospital, where she died three hours later. The autopsy revealed she came to her death from a blow on the head and internal injuries in addition to some 30 bruises and "burns" about the body.
