### CANCER CAMPAIGN FOR \$12,000,000 STARTS APRIL 15

(Continued from page one) Read Literature Carefully "Therefore, every citizen receiving a piece of printed campaign literature, whether he intends to

give a small gift, a large gift or no gift at all, should read the literature carefully never-the-less, for it does contain the danger signals of cancer."

He reminded that anyone who desires to give, but is not contacted by a solicitor, may mail his donation to the local campaign headquarters or to the American Cancer Society, 350 Fifth Avenue,

New York 1, N. Y. "Or more simply," he said, "any one can put his gift—cash check or money order—in an envelope, mark it 'CANCER,' affix the proper postage and drop it in the nearest mail box."

**Death Rate Increasing** "I cannot emphasize too strongly the seriousness of the fight on cancer," Chairman Tucker stated

"The death rate is increasing. There will be 22% more deaths this year than in 1936 and in 1956 there will be an even larger increase in the number of cancer deaths—unless we act now to curb this dreaded disease. We must have funds by which to aid those now suffering from cancer and to spread the message that if detected in time 50% of all

cancer cases could be cured. Also need money to continue Society's coordinated research tack against this Number One Enemy of all mankind. On every eight of us is doomed die of cancer unless our efforts to combat this disease are successful. Cancer costs lives. Cancer control costs money. Which you rather give?"
