derstood that the plans to visit Fort Caswell is an outgrowth of the possibility that the big property may be put up by the government for disposal. Should the government decide to dispose of the property the department will be standing by to do everything possible to bring about development.

However, there is still nothing definite to the effect that the government plans to dispose of Fort Caswell. A recent letter from Secretary of Navy Forrestal was to the effect that the Coast Guard had expressed an interest in the property. In the event the Coast Guard fails to take over, the secretary said, the Fort may then be turned over to the surplus property custodian for disposal.  
In his communication to local interests Mr. Council did not state how many of the Conservation Department men would be here in the party on May 14. He merely advised that the board would meet here on that date and that they wished to visit Fort Caswell and Long Beach.
