### Brunswick Men Join The Army

#### Three Brunswick County White Men And One Colored Man Enlist In The Regular Army

During the week ending May 11, a greater number of men were accepted for enlistment in the Regular Army than during any similar period since the opening of the Wilmington Recruiting Station. Thirty-two men were transported to Ft. Bragg for swearing in and assignment, Lt. N. G. Cottle, Commanding Officer, stated this week. During this same period the Wilmington Recruiting staff had 190 interviews with men seeking informa-

tion about the Army recruiting program. Most of these men will return later to enlist, Lt. Cottle said. Elaborating on last week's recruiting activities, Lt. Cottle attributes the continued success of his station to efficient and well-trained personnel; timely presentation to the public through the media of advertising and personal contact; the splendid opportunities offered by the new Regular Army; and the splendid cooperation rendered by city officials, civic organizations, business firms, radio stations, and newspapers. White applicants accepted from this area were: Pedro Sanchez, Bolivia; Tony Baker, Bolivia; Robert D. Lee, Leland. The colored applicant was: Charles T. Brown, Winnabow.
