

Ramblers Win Eastern Crown

Wins Series Championship Here From Bladenboro By Score Of 7 To 1; Winning Pitcher Allen, Stages Comeback

The steady, 6-hit hurler Oliver "Snag" Allen, a hard hand of Ramblers from Bladenboro, won the State League championship here Sunday, when they finished a hard-fighting Bladenboro Spinner team, 7 to 1.

Allen gave the Ramblers the lead in the first inning, when he pitched the rubber to the newly-arrived Bladenboro pitcher, and also was the winning pitcher for the series for Allen.

Allen's boys finished one ahead of the Whiteville team in the league race. In the final game, Whiteville was upset by Bladenboro while the Maner-led team of Wallace, 4th runner, Masonboro won the title game, 3-3.

Allen came through with a 9th inning rally to pull out of the fire, 4-3; getting the stage for yesterday.

Ramblers served advance notice that they were here for business, as they marked up in the initial rack on

singles by lead-off man Hugh Griffith and Burney Covington, the former tallying when Stubbs errored Lynn Rowan's easy grounder.

Bladenboro made it one-all in the second as Johnny Hammonds reached first on Griffith's bobble, scoring on singles by Ted Russ and Garland Stubbs.

Levy Bridger, Jr., trying gallantly to hold the pace set by Allen, matched him pitch for pitch until the fatal fifth; when the Ramblers won the game by denting the rubber thrice on hits by Levy Heath, Hugh Griffith, Linwood Rowan, and Jimmy Cain's error. Maner's Ramblers' Wreck reached Bladenboro's one-man pitching staff for another trio in the sixth with Tom Liles singling, scoring on errors by Cain and Hardy as Luke Collier reached second safely; Billy Hardison went out to Hammonds, unassisted; Jess Jackson's wild heave put Farrow on safely, with Collier scoring, Heath hit a blooper single, Griffith bingled to center, counting Farrow; Covington singled, leading the bases; Rowan hit to Hardy who nipped Heath at the plate, with Russ doubling Griffith off third.

Allen, who is an example of a great comeback in semi-pro ball, twirled masterfully to clinch the pennant for his club. He allowed only one extra-base hit, a triple by lead-off man Woodrow Jackson, of the Spinners, in the first inning. After Jacobs was erased

at the plate on an attempted squeeze-play, The Snag was superb, fanning 11 Spins and walking only 2. Just how helpless the losers were against his slants is shown by the fact that only one Spinner, Ted Russ, in the 4th, was able to hit the ball out of the infield, with the exception of their hits. Allen was almost rendered helpless by being hit by a pitched ball some years back, but has made a gallant comeback, being still one of the best semipro in Eastern North Carolina.

Young Levy Bridger, who pitched his heart out trying to win the pennant for Bladenboro, gave up 10 blows, fanned 6 Ramblers, and walked none. He has shown marvelous control all season, and particularly throughout the series; walking only two batters in all three contests. Given a little more help, this Bridger might have made the final story of the First Eastern State League series a different one.

Hugh Griffith, Rambler short-fielder, led the batters with 3 for 4, while Jimmy Cain, of the Spinners, hit 2 for 4. Cain was the Series leading batter with 6 for 11. Woodrow Jacobs also hit 2 for 4.

Thus comes to an end the first season of the Eastern State League, one which was successful; and an end to the first series of the loop which can be termed a great success. The members of both the Bladenboro Spinners
