and all of the other numerous essentials to the operation of a lunch room. After the first food supplies were purchased they had about \$25.00 left over, according to Principal O. C. Bruton, when he was interviewed this week. "We still have just about \$25.00 left over."
But with neither gain nor loss of capital, an enormous amount of good has been done by the lunch room since it first went into operation. With 450 students at Bolivia 250, or more than half the boys and girls, are regular patrons of the lunch room. For 15 cents daily they get a warm, substantial lunch of eggs, meat, bread, fruit juice, milk, etc. They

get this right there in the warm, comfortable building, seated at good tables.

The daily lunches are prepared by Mrs. Carrie Tharp with Mrs. Lillian Mercer and Mrs. Pearl Sullivan as helpers. These ladies, in turn, have the unstinted help of the domestic science class of the high school.

A fine thing in connection with the lunch room operation is that it has the sympathetic understanding and wholehearted support of the patrons of the school. An unheard and unannounced visit

there this week revealed the full of students and ladies of community. With such interest the Bolivia women folks show the school lunch room, it follows that the men folks are no interested.
