WILMINGTON GIRL SCOUTS

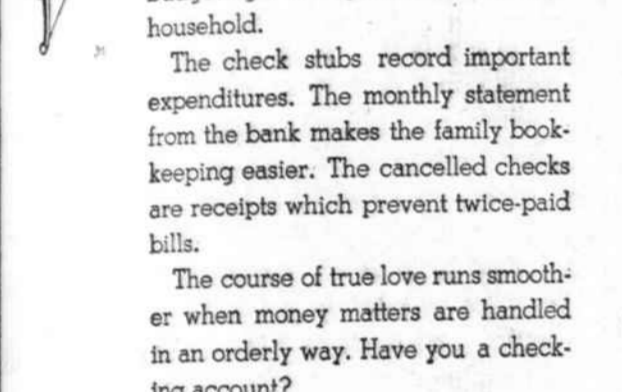
